Whereas, Mercer County recognizes the month of May as Asian-American History Month and celebrates the accomplishments and contributions of Mercer County residents of Asian heritage with a ceremony on May 19, 2009; and

Whereas, among those honored is the Association of Indians in America, the oldest national association of Asian Indians in the United States that has advocated on behalf of the more than two million Asian Indians in America for more than 30 years; and
